Council-owned Housing for Older Persons'

Whanganui District Council own 16 complexes throughout the Whanganui city district for citizens who are 65+ years of age and have limited financial means. Across the addresses listed below there is a total of 261 tenanted units and 8 vacant units.

Commercial Buildings
